The Minpins by Roald Dahl

This unit will involve the children writing about personal experiences. This will also involve using joining clauses such as 'and'/'or'. The use of suffixes -er, -est and turning them into adjectives and the use of -ly to turn adjectives into adverbs. Using expanded noun phrases for description (for example, the blue butterfly), correct choice and consistent use of present tense and past tense throughout writing and the use of the progressive form of verbs in the present and past tense to mark actions in progress.

Online Safety

Children learn about how what they do online leaves a trail called a digital footprint. They will look at how to improve the efficiency of their online searches, the types of websites that are best for children to access when looking for information, as well as how to identify inappropriate content and the actions they should take if they do. Children will be introduced to the term 'cyberbullying' and look at how they should communicate online and deal with instances of people being unkind via digital means.
