Breakfast Club

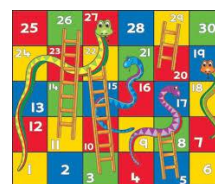
Breakfast Club runs from **8.00am** each morning. Breakfast fees will remain at **£2.00 per day**.

Staffing for September 2022



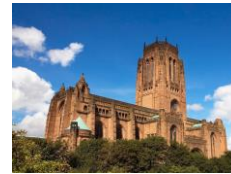

Communication, Speech and Language

Good communication, speech and language skills are essential if a child is to learn effectively. Here are some ideas to help your child if they are struggling in this area.

How to help your child's listening, language and communication skills:

- **Reduce any background noise** - e.g. turn off the TV when you are playing or having a conversation. Background noise makes it harder for your child to hear conversations and listen to what is going on around them. –
- Try to be **face to face** with your child so they can see you easily. Your child will be looking at our lip patterns and facial expressions when we are talking.
- **Attract your child's attention** by calling their name or gently touching them on the arm.
- **Speak clearly and naturally**, do not exaggerate your lip patterns.
- **Break down** instructions.
- **Repeat** information particularly important words.
- **Pause** and give your child time to think about what you have said. Some children need up to 10 seconds before they're ready to respond.
- **Use visual clues** including natural gestures, signs, pointing and facial expressions to help them understand.
- **Join in and play** with toys and books that they have chosen.
- **Avoid** asking too many questions, comment on what your child is doing instead.
- **Respond** to what your child is saying even if you don't understand everything they are saying.

If you have any concerns about your child's hearing please contact your GP and share the information with your child's teacher so that they can help your child.
